Once fiber construction is completed in Dalhart, the construction crew will move to Stratford ... then, Hartley, Channing and Boys Ranch. Eventually, all of XIT's service area will be fiber optic plant.

Hopefully, soon, we will be able to start to get back to some form of normalcy. Until then ... let's practice a little bit of kindness and patience and make sure we do everything possible to keep each other safe and healthy.

XIT's Online Bill Pay

With the Coronavirus still in full swing, did you know you can sign up for XIT's Online Bill Pay and pay your bill right from home anytime? You will no longer have to call in or get in the car to drive to the office to pay!

Signing up for XIT's Online Bill Pay is quick

and easy! Just go to XIT's website at <u>www.xit.net</u> and click on the Online Bill Pay Link on the left side of the screen. Then follow these simple instructions:

- Click on Register Here.
- Enter the invoice number (Not the XIT Account Number) and the amount due from your current XIT Communications/XIT Rural Telephone invoice.
- Click on the Recaptcha Box 'I'm Not A Robot' and click on the screens to verify. Once you get the green check mark, click Continue.
- Enter your email address. Enter a password (password must contain at least 6 characters and one number, uppercase letter or special character). Enter password again to confirm.
- Pick one of the security questions by clicking on the drop-down menu. Provide the answer.
- Click Register.
- The screen will show account created and it will say Success! Your Account has successfully been created. You will then receive an email to verify your email address.
- Click on the email link to verify your email address. It will say Success! Your email address has been successfully verified.
- Now you can log into the account by clicking Redirect to Login.



Extra Cyber Security

These days, hackers are getting bolder with their tactics of trying to take advantage of people online. Unsuspecting victims click on fake websites, put in their personal information, and BAM ... hackers get the information without the victim even realizing what they just did! Here are some tips when shopping online to protect yourself against fake websites:



- Watch the URL address. A favorite trick for hackers is to create addresses similar to popular companies. This is especially common if you are redirected to a website from another page. For example, <u>www.targett.com</u> instead of <u>www.target.com</u>. Did you catch the extra "t" in the address? A lot of people don't! Make sure to pay attention to the spelling and make sure the web address is correct. Bookmarking sites you use a lot is a great thing to do so you don't accidently go to a fake website by mistake. If you are unsure if a website address is fake, contact the business and ask them for their website address. They will be happy to give it to you!
- Legitimate websites where you can purchase an item or service should have their information secured. If the website address starts with https:// the "s" in the address stands for secure. If the website does not have the "s", we would not recommend giving out personal information, unless you can see some other security information. Another indicator is a padlock before the address. If you see a padlock, the website has one of the highest levels of encryption and security. You can click on the padlock and you should see the site's security information.
- Look for trusted seals from DigiCert, Verisign or Symantec. A fake site may have one of these logos posted on their site, but if you click on the logo and it doesn't open a new window with the website's security information, it is not a legitimate, secure site.
- Watch for very poor grammar and spelling errors on the site. Excessive mistakes can mean the website was put up quickly and not carefully setup, so beware of fraud.
- Look for reliable contact information. How can you contact the company if you have an issue with a purchase? Try out the phone number or the live chat. Make sure someone answers and that it is not a pre-recorded voicemail or disconnected number or a generic response on the live chat.
- Lastly, shopping sites should offer standard payment options such as credit cards or PayPal. If a site wants you to use a wire transfer, money order or other form of unsecured payment, we recommend using another site.

To make a local call from your exchange, dial only the seven-digit telephone number. Your local (toll free) calling area includes your local exchange along with the others listed. All other calls you must dial a 1 + area code and phone number.

When Thunder Roars ... Go Indoors!

During this time of year, it's a common occurrence for thunderstorms to build and break out within a short period of time. When storms come up, how do you know when the conditions are safe outside or when it's time to head inside?

According to the National Weather Service website, each year thunderstorms produce an estimated 25 million cloud-to-ground lightning flashes in the United States and approximately 300 people are struck by some of these flashes. Of the people struck, about 30 die due to their injuries! So far this year, 8 people have died from lightning related injuries in the states. Some people will suffer neurological injuries that can stay with them for the rest of their lives. We must take these storms seriously every time they occur!



Experts say that thunder can be heard for a distance of about 10 miles. If you hear thunder, it is best to start looking for shelter right away. Lightning can strike approximately 6-10 miles from the base of a thundercloud, so even if the storm seems far away, its best to go to shelter early. Remember that no place outside is safe when thunderstorms hit. Once inside, stay away from windows, doors, plumbing and anything that conducts electricity like computers, phones, and TV's. If there are no buildings to go into, a vehicle is the next best place to go. Stay inside until the storm has passed and it's been at least 30 minutes since the last rumble of thunder has been heard.

There are many myths about lightning, and we'd like to help clear up some of these misconceptions. Test your knowledge and see how many you can get right:

Myth: Lightning never strikes the same place twice.

Fact: Lightning often strikes the same place repeatedly, especially if it's a tall isolated object.

Myth: Rubber tires on a car protect you from lightning by insulating you from the ground. Fact: Most cars are safe from lightning, but it is the metal roof and sides that protect you, not the rubber tires.

Myth: A lightning victim is electrified. If you touch them, you'll be electrocuted. Fact: The human body does not store electricity. It is perfectly safe to touch a lightning victim and give them first aid!

Myth: If outside in a thunderstorm, you should seek shelter under a tree to stay dry. Fact: Being underneath a tree is the 2nd leading cause of lightning casualties. Better to get wet than fried!

Myth: Structures with metal, or metal on the body (jewelry, phone, watches, etc.) attract lightning.

Fact: Height, pointy shape and isolation are the dominant factors controlling where a lightning bolt will strike. The presence of metal makes no different on where lightning will strike.

Myth: If trapped outside and lightning is about to strike, I should lie flat on the ground or crouch down to reduce risk of being struck.

Fact: Lying flat increases your chance of being affected by deadly ground current. Crouching doesn't make you any safer. Run to a substantial building or hard topped vehicle. Keep moving to shelter.
